It is good to be home! The last two weeks have felt like quite a whirlwind of events. To be honest I am still processing and trying to wrap my head around all that we experienced on this wonderful and rewarding mission trip.

We took off for Nashville on Saturday, June 29 th . From there, it was two full days of non-stop travel including one sixteen and half hour flight. All seven team members landed in Cambodia at 9:30 am on July 2. Nic Davidson, the leader of our mission trip in Cambodia met us there with a whole welcoming crew of people including his kids, another missionary who is taking a gap year with them, and two NAC seminarians from Minnesota and South Dakota. After checking into our hotel, we grabbed a quick lunch, and said Mass at the local Catholic Church. I might add that it was a God moment that the parish was St. John the Evangelist.

We then went straight to an orphanage that is run by the Missionaries of Charity. This Orphanage housed about forty children, the youngest being 3 months old and the oldest being four years old. The team quickly got to work being greeted by these joyful children as they sang to us and greeted us as new friends. Some showed the older kids how to use watercolor paint for the first time, and we read books to them. Thanks to all who donated these! The kids all loved these activities, and they were not ready for them to end, but soon it was nap and snack time for them, and we were off to our next stop.

We visited the orphanage several times and each time was filled with blessings. The guys in our group were in charge of helping the little boys play recorders that we had brought with us. Turns out boys are the same no matter what country you are in, and when handed the recorders they immediately did what all little boys do, and they used them as swords to fight one another. We then headed to the next mission site where we were greeted by a group of about 50 grade school through high school students who were hanging out at the Pastoral Home. This home is nothing short of a miracle, and is a haven for these children and for the community. They primarily live in the local slums. These kids were joyful, helpful, polite, and playful. This home is run by a local couple that has two young children and is pregnant with their third. They were asked by the local priest to run this home for kids in the area and to help teach them about God and about living a Catholic life. Nic and his wife Jacelynn have worked closely with this couple since moving to Cambodia two years ago. What they have done there to give the kids a safe place to pray, play, and eat is nothing short of a miracle. This couple welcomes any child into their home from after school until it is time for bed. They also have five teen girls who live with them so that they do not have to do what most impoverished teenage girls their age often end up in: prostitution. Evenings there closed with Night Prayer and a beautiful hymn to Our Blessed Mother.

There is so much to tell that this will likely be a series. A big first takeaway is that we should be grateful for being in our country, and what that affords us in faith, opportunity, and family.
