Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Happy Mother's Day to all mothers!! We literally owe everything to you. Thank you for all you have done for each of us! This is also a fitting time to talk about our universal and heavenly Mother! Since it is the month of Mary, I wanted to focus once again on one of the great Marian apparitions that have received the endorsement of the Church. This week on May 13th, we celebrate once again the Memorial of Our Lady of Fatima, and the 107th anniversary of the apparition of Our Lady to three shepherd children in Fatima, Portugal.

This amazing and miraculous apparition of Mary to these simple children is one of the greatest Church approved apparition sites in the world. When she appeared to them six times between May 13th and October 13th of 1917, she also relayed to them a series of messages and warnings for the Faithful of the world. The thrust of the messages was that the Faithful were to devote themselves to prayer and penance for the conversion of sinners and to atone for the immorality and indifference shown to Jesus and His great Sacrifice. A particular emphasis was placed on the prayer of the Rosary for world peace.

Encompassed in the apparitions to the children were three socalled 'secrets' that were to be revealed at a later time, as well as a request for the peace and well-being of the world. The first of these was a vision of the souls in hell. It served as a warning for the living to stay close to the grace of God. It was also an encouragement to those with faith to pray for the conversion of sinners so that they would not have to endure the torment of eternal separation from God and His love.

The second secret was a prediction of the coming of World War II, and a plea for the consecration of Russia to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. She told them that if the consecration was not done, that the errors of Communism would spread and that many evils would come forth that would plunge the world into war, strife, and unspeakable human suffering, and the Church and particularly the Holy Father would have many difficulties. If however, the consecration were to be done with the Holy Father in union with the bishops of the world, then Russia would be converted and a period of profound peace would descend upon the world. The Third secret was a particular vision that was received concerning the possible martyrdom of many of the Faithful along with the Holy Father, with an unspecified timeline. Perhaps my favorite aspect of Our Lady's apparitions there, and the greatest proof of its authenticity, is what happened on October 13th at her last apparition: the miracle of the sun. It is perhaps the miracle seen by more eyewitnesses than any other in the history of the world. The best part of it is that many skeptics and atheists, many of whom were journalists, came to show that the whole event was a hoax. Instead, nearly all of the 70,000 people gathered there saw the sun make wild and unnatural gyrations, dance, and at one point seem to fall to the earth. The result was that many of those same disbelievers became Catholic.

God the Father chose to bring Christ to earth through Mary. He also chooses to bring the world to Christ, especially in this modern age, through Mary. Let us always have recourse to her for all our needs and for the purification of the world. Immaculate Heart of Mary, pray for us! Sincerely in Mary's Immaculate Heart, -Fr. Chris
