

Dear Parish Family,

This weekend, we celebrate the Epiphany. The word comes from the Greek word Epiphania, meaning "revelation". It is based on the biblical story that tells of the Magi or Three Kings: Caspar, Melchior and Balthasar - who saw a bright star on the night Christ was born and followed it to Bethlehem. There they found the Christ child and presented him with gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh. The legendary visit would later gave rise to the custom of gift giving at Christmas on the Feast of the Epiphany, today traditionally observed on January 6.

A custom in homes around the world is the blessing or chalking of the doors. Families inscribe above the door the first two numbers of the year 20, +, the letter C for Casper, +, M for Melchoir, +, B for Balthasar, + 22 and the phrase may God bless this house. It should look like this:

> 20+C+M+B+22 Bless this house



St. Elizabeth Ann Seton | January 4

The patron saint of Catholic schools. St. Elizabeth Ann Seton (August 28, 1774 – January 4, 1821) was born in New York City to a prominent family of the Episcopal faith. When she turned 19, she married a wealthy businessman with whom she had five children. He later died of tuberculosis in 1803, leaving her a young widow. After discovering the Catholic faith in Italy, where her husband had died, she returned to New York and converted to Catholicism in 1805.



St. Elizabeth Ann Seton was canonized September 14, 1975 in St. Peter's Square by Pope Paul VI and was the first citizen born in the United States to be given the title of "saint.
